The minor midget AE Raiders beat guest Dundas 4-2 on Tuesday to take a 2-1 series lead in the best-of-5 OMHA Group 1-3 quarterfinal. Game four will be in Dundas Thursday and a game five would be played Saturday in Georgetown at 8 p.m.
