H3R Human Resources Services of Georgetown's Managing Director Michael Bennett CHRP, has been appointed to the board of directors of STRIDE (Supported Training & Rehabilitation in Diverse Environments), a Halton not-for-profit organization that serves the employment needs of residents with mental illness.

"I am very proud to be joining the board of STRIDE. For almost 30 years STRIDE has been serving the residents of Halton providing critical support, employment training and employment to persons with mental illness. The work they do in the community goes highly unrecognized, but it is important work for a group of people who face tough challenges finding employment. STRIDE Executive Director Anita Lloyd added, "We are pleased to have Mr. Bennett join our board. His over 20 years of experience in human resources and proven commitment and contribution to previous volunteer endeavours within Halton will without a doubt add value to STRIDE."

Carberry has contributed to and continues to support many of HIEC's
