this theatre project is an assignment that is worth 25% of their final IB grade.

Director Michelle Duquette has been working with students George Bamforth, Leah Johansen, Jamie Nicol, Shannon McMullin, Nicole Hanley, Eric Smith and Matt Blundell to create the entire production, from acting to set/lighting design and costumes.

Note: If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a Public Meeting or make written submissions to Halton Region before the proposed Official Plan Amendment is adopted, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision of Halton Regional Council to the Ontario Municipal Board.

If a person or public body does not make submissions at a Public Meeting or make written submissions to Halton Region before the proposed Official Plan Amendment is adopted, the person or public body may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Ontario Municipal Board unless, in the opinion of the Board, there are reasonable grounds to add the person or public body as a party.

If you wish to be notified of the adoption of the proposed Official Plan Amendment, you must make a written request to the Regional Clerk at Halton Region, 1151 Bronte Road, Oakville, Ontario L6M 3L1.
