

Three facing impaired charges

A Mississauga man is facing charges after Halton Police investigated a driving complaint about 6:15 p.m. Saturday. Police located the vehicle near Main and Mill St. in Acton.

Charged with impaired driving and having over 80 mg of alcohol in 100 ml of blood is Alan Stevenson, 54.

Halton Police received a complaint from a citizen about a driver in Georgetown about 4:30 p.m. Sunday. Police located the vehicle in the parking lot at the LCBO. The driver was arrested.

Charged with having over 80 mg of alcohol in 100 ml of blood is Alan McDonald, 62, of Georgetown.

A Brampton man was charged after police stopped a vehicle on Guelph St. Sunday about 7:20 p.m.

Charged with having over 80 mg of alcohol in 100 ml of blood is Kevin Wilkes, 25.

Halton Hills firefighters were called to a truck fire in the area of Fourth Line, north of 15 Sideroad about 11:50 a.m. last Wednesday.

The driver said his truck was sluggish and when he looked into the mirror he noticed smoke. The truck was destroyed.

The value is estimated at \$20,000.

Firefighters were called to another vehicle fire in a Mill St., Georgetown driveway about 1 a.m. Saturday. When they arrived they found a 1994 Ford Grand Marquis fully involved and the flames had spread to the porch of the nearby home. The fires were quickly extinguished and the home was checked to ensure fire hadn't reached it.

Damage to the home is estimated at \$3,000 and \$2,000 to the vehicle.

Halton Hills fire crews were kept busy Saturday about 5:30 p.m. when they were called to extinguish multiple fires along the CN tracks in the area of Lamb St.

The fires, which spread from a small bonfire, were found to be burning against two buildings belonging to CN Rail. The fires were extinguished without any interruption to trains and the investigation was turned over to the CN Police.

About 8 a.m. Sunday Halton Hills firefighters responded to a report of a fire in an abandoned building on River Dr.

When they arrived they couldn't see any indication of a fire, but further investigation revealed three male youths had a small fire burning in one part of the building. Crews extinguished the fire and Halton Regional Police were called to investigate. There was no damage.
