

Special Waste Drop-off Day

To make the recycling of household hazardous waste and electronic waste more convenient to residents, Halton Region holds Special Waste Drop-off Days throughout the year.

Special Waste Drop-off Days are for Halton residents only. Commercial waste, tires, reuse materials (clothing, etc.), metal and appliances are not accepted.

The following materials will be accepted for drop off free of charge:

Household Hazardous Waste

Acceptable materials: pesticides, paint, stains, motor oil, antifreeze, varsol, fuels, cleaners, pool chemicals, pharmaceuticals, propane tanks, household batteries, car batteries, and fluorescent tubes and bulbs.



Unacceptable materials: needles, syringes and lancets, asbestos, commercial and industrial waste, PCBs, explosives, and ammunition.

Electronics

Acceptable materials: computers, stereos, phones, TVs, VCRs, DVD players and computer monitors

Unacceptable materials: metal and appliances, vacuums, and scrap metal



If you are unsure whether an item will be accepted at a Special Waste Drop-off Day, call Halton Region.

Unable to attend?

If you are unable to attend a Special Waste Drop-off Day, the following options are available:

- Household hazardous waste and electronics can be dropped off free of charge at the Halton Waste Management Site (HWMS), 5400 Regional Road 25, Milton. Visit www.halton.ca/waste for a list of acceptable materials. The HWMS is open Monday to Saturday, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Fees at the Halton Waste Management Site

For general waste and use of the Container Station, the user fees are:

- Up to 50 kg – \$5/load
- 51 to 150 kg – \$10/load
- Over 150 kg – 14.3 cents/kg starting from 0 kg

Did You Know?

The following materials are accepted free of charge at the Halton Waste Management Site:

- Electronics (computers, printers, and televisions, etc.) – up to 5 items per load
- Household hazardous waste* (paint, batteries, antifreeze, propane tanks, car oil) – up to 20 L per trip
- Used tires – up to 5 tires per load
