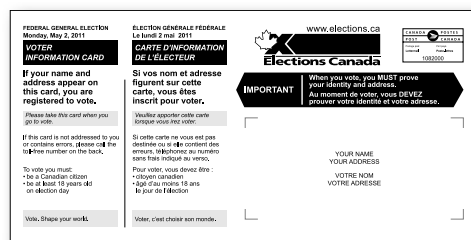

MONDAY, MAY 2, IS ELECTION DAY

DID YOU RECEIVE THIS CARD?



YES – then you're registered. The card tells you where and when to vote. Take it with you when you go to vote.

NO, or you found an error – contact Elections Canada now.

YOU CAN VOTE BEFORE ELECTION DAY.

- **At the advance polls** on Friday, April 22; Saturday, April 23; or Monday, April 25, from noon to 8 p.m.
- **By mail or at your local Elections Canada office**, if you apply by 6 p.m. on Tuesday, April 26.

TO VOTE, YOU MUST:

- be a Canadian citizen
- be at least 18 years old on election day
- prove your identity and address
