## Defending champ Bulldogs okay with being 'targets'

The Ontario Jr. B Lacrosse Association's regular season gets underway for the Halton Hills Bulldogs with their annual lengthy bus trip to eastern Ontario for a pair of games.

But this time around, the Bulldogs will be viewed a little differently by their opponents as they carry the titles of defending Canadian and provincial champions to the arena in 2011.

"We've got the targets on our backs now, but that's okay," said Halton Hills head coach Blaine McCauley.

"We'll just have to make sure we're prepared for what other teams are going to throw at us and how they'll approach us. Yes we did lose some veteran leadership and scoring, but we're looking at giving some of the younger kids the opportunity to fill the void. The best part about this group is that they know what's ahead and what it takes to get to a Founders Cup. There's an added expectation for us now and just because we've got some younger faces in there, it doesn't make a difference. We had nine rookies in our lineup for the Canadian championship game last year."

About three-quarters of the 2010 roster is back, including both goaltenders in Ryan Kelly and Dustin Hanzelka. The size of the nets has been enlarged for all levels of lacrosse this year

but that didn't seem to trouble the Bulldogs in their final exhibition game last weekend as they blanked the visiting Orangeville Northmen 8-0.

Up front, the 'Dogs lost top scorers Shane Scott and Nic Grasby but will still be potent with Founders Cup overtime hero Dylan Gilbert, Jordan Dance, Tyler Ferreira, Michael Licata, Seth Laidlaw and Mike MacDonald back in the fold.

The two-way talents of Ethan O'Connor and the stout defending of captain Nik Matwijczyn will also be missed but the team has plenty of depth with Brad Kri, Pete Laidlaw, Kody Lyons, Jayson Crawford, Justin Reid and Chris Haynes back in the fold as well.

Veteran forward Blake Kenny should also add some scoring punch after coming over from Gloucester.

Halton Hills begins its campaign Saturday night against Kahnawake and will visit Akwesasne on Sunday

afternoon.

They also have road dates with the Green Gaels and Orillia next week before taking on Oakville in the home opener on Thursday, May 5.

McCauley said it hasn't been determined when the Bulldogs will unveil the Canadian and Ontario championship banners in the Alcott Arena as they hope to have as many of last year's players as possible back for the ceremony.

The 'Dogs also announced that Todd Bell, who coached the Halton Hills intermediates last year, will be the head coach of the new Jr. C team.
