

Come be an artist with your dad

Are you ready for something new and interesting this Father's Day? Why not come out to Glen Williams and see what all the artists have planned for you! A unique opportunity awaits you and your family as you step into a world of art and you and dad become the artists!

On Sunday June 19th, Father's Day, from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m., 23 Williams Mill artists have planned a day out not soon to be forgotten. Blow your own glass piece, cast the hands of you and your dad together, burn into wood a Father's Day message, try your hand at soapstone carving. Listen to book readings from a well known book illustrator. Participate in and watch demonstrations of clay hand building and wheel turned pots.

You can also take a guided tour of the historic Mill buildings and discover how the Mill helped shape the history

of the area. Williams Mill history tours will run at 11 a.m., 1 p.m. and 3 p.m., with limited numbers.

Take this opportunity to learn from the internationally active professional artists. Learn about the classes, services and commissions offered at the Mill and get a chance to discuss how the artists do their work.

Wind up your visit sipping soft drinks and nibbling finger foods in the Gallery with a visit to Mill Artists' Summer show, Art Comes to Life. This afternoon at the Williams Mill is one you won't want to miss!

All activities are free and "drop-by" except for the Glass Blowing (\$20) and the Father/Child Hand-Casting (\$40) which require pre-registration by calling 905-873-8203 or signing up at Williams Mill Gallery.

Big DADDY Festival facts you should know

- Almost all events are free or a nominal fee (a loonie or toonie); there will be a charge for food and drinks at the booths (and of course the restaurants) in various locations.

- All events are open to the public so anyone can attend, but as the name of the Festival implies, events are geared to families, and particularly to things that fathers can do with their children, or grandfathers with children/grandchildren. Of course, moms are also

welcome.

- There is considerable parking in and around downtown Georgetown in designated parking areas. There is plenty of parking space in Acton at Prospect Park. Parking at Glen Williams and Norval is also available.

- Only a few parts of streets immediately adjacent to Main Street in Georgetown will be closed. It is not anticipated that this will disrupt traffic to any significant degree.
