Soccer duo heading south

A couple of Georgetown District High School graduates will be headed south in August to play for NCAA Division II universities on soccer scholarships.

Central defender Holly Bigg will attend Charleston University in West Virginia and midfielder Justine Rodrigues has signed on with Gannon University in Erie, Pa. starting in August.

Both played for the Rebels' senior girls' soccer team again this spring and have enjoyed success with their out-of-town club teams.

Limehouse resident Bigg captured the Ontario Cup last year with her Erin Mills Eagles' under-17 squad and earned silver medals at the national championships in Newfoundland, while Georgetown South's Rodrigues has been on three Brams' United teams that won provincial titles as well.

The 5-foot-8 Rodrigues has also been starting on defence for the Guyanese women's national team that was newly formed in 2009 as her dad Rick was born on the Caribbean island nation.

She'll likely miss Guyana's CONCACAF under-21 qualifying matches in September due to school commitments, but is nonetheless excited to begin classes in Gannon's marketing program.

"It's something I really wanted to accomplish after my sister did it, so I'm following in her footsteps and I think that was what my family had in mind."

"I chose Gannon because I really liked the coach and their style of play and it's not that far away, which I really wanted so my parents can come see me play," Rodrigues said.

"The coach said maybe they'll play me at inside midfield, but I'm not sure. I'm kind of all over the place and whatever team I play for, my position's different."

Melissa, an Acton High School grad, finished her four years at the University of Cincinnati last spring on a soccer scholarship with a Bachelor of Science degree. She is moving on to earn her two-year Business masters degree at Tiffin University in Ohio and will be the assistant coach on the women's soccer team there starting in August.

Holly Bigg said it was a great source of comfort knowing she had a sibling who had experienced the recruiting game and signed a national letter of intent to an NCAA school.

"(Melissa) told me all about the whole process and how things went going into it. Just a what-to-look-for, what-not-to-look-for kind of thing was a big help," said Holly,
