The Hooligans win place in Festival

The Toronto Sketch Comedy Festival presented its fourth annual "Sketch-Com-Aggedon" recently, showcasing 45 troupes competing to win cash prize and an automatic entry into the Sketch Comedy Festival in November.

DYT Productions Performance Studio's teen Improv/Sketch Troupe, The Hooligans and won audience choice for the evening with a five-minute sketch.

Hooligans members include Georgetown residents Alyssa Strachan and Erich Knoespel.

After five days and 45 adult troupes competing, The Hooligans were crowned the winners of "Sketch-Com-Aggedon", twice being named the audience's choice.

The Hooligans made history as the first teen troupe to ever win the competition and get automatic entry into the No-

some substance — interesting characters, and a thought-provoking story, something that the audience can identify with, and talk about afterwards."



NOTICE OF PASSAGE OF DEVELOPMENT CHARGE BY-LAW AMENDMENT 2009-090

TAKE NOTICE that on June 28, 2011 The Council of the Corporation of the Town of Caledon passed BY-LAW NUMBER 2011-082, an amendment to BY-LAW NUMBER 2009-090, being a by-law to impose and provide for the payment of development charges for municipal services in the Town of Caledon.

AND TAKE NOTICE that any person or organization may appeal the by-law to the Ontario Municipal Board under Section 14 of the Development Charges Act, by filing with the Clerk of the Corporation of the Town of Caledon on or before the 8th day of August 2011 a notice of appeal setting out the objection to the by-law and the reasons supporting the objection.

The by-law applies to all lands in the Town of Caledon. The development charges amendments provides for the following additional development charge discounts and exemptions, which came into effect on June 28, 2011:

Additional development charge discount for "Green" non-retail, non-residential development for a two-year period (July 8, 2011 to July 7, 2013);

An exemption for hotel, motel or lodge facilities that provide temporary overnight accommodation for the travelling public and contain more than 29 overnight guest rooms;

Amendments to the administration of the existing development charge exemption for Bed and Breakfast establishments.
