

## Bikes stolen

Police are investigating the theft of several bicycles in Halton Hills over the past few days.

A purple and white BMX bike valued at \$600 was stolen from Centennial Public School Friday. The bike was left unattended.

A \$400 Free Agent Stiletto model was stolen from the driveway of a Rexway Dr. home sometime late Thursday or early Friday, and three mountain bikes (approximately \$200 each) were taken from a Somerville Rd. property sometime early Sunday.

## Man convicted on careless driving charge laid after 2008 collision causing death

A Vaughan man has been convicted in Milton court of careless driving in connection with a 2008 collision that resulted in the death of a Georgetown woman.

Carolyn McTavish, 50, was struck and killed by a car on Feb. 21, 2008 when she was retrieving her mail from her rural mailbox on Winston Churchill Blvd.

Ottavio Ariganello, 33, of Maple was convicted in Milton Provincial Offences Court recently on the charge. He was fined \$1,000 and the Justice of the Peace imposed a 12-month driving suspension.

Halton Regional Police Sgt. Paul Da-



vies said, "the professional and dedicated efforts of the Halton Regional Police Collision Reconstruction Unit contributed to the successful conviction."

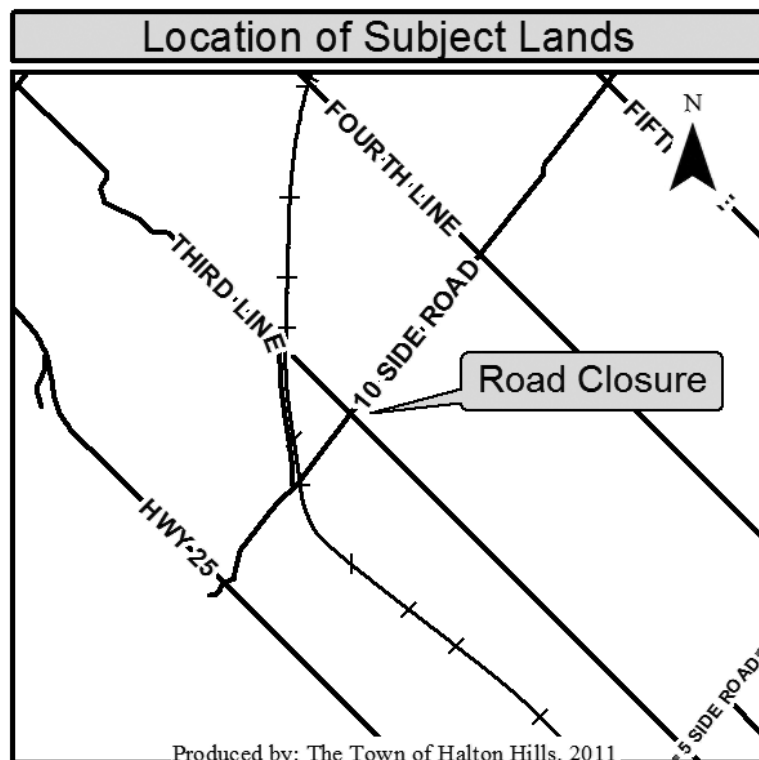
