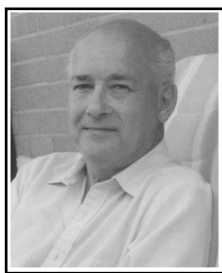

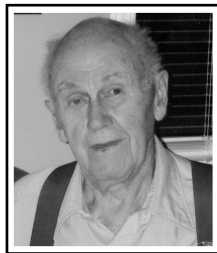

Gordon was a resident of the Halton County  
Scotch Block most of his life. As a young man  
he assumed responsibility for his widowed  
mother and took over his dad's Jersey dairy  
farm. Later with his own family to support he  
supplemented his farming income by working at  
the Ford Motor Co. in Oakville but always re-  
mained in his own words that "damned o'fe  
farmer". He was a lifelong member of Boston  
Presbyterian Church and took great pride in his  
Scottish heritage and the Hume family contribu-  
tions to the founding and support over the  
generations (7) to that congregation. He was a  
member of the Steam Era Club serving as the  
treasurer for some ten years and eventually  
was honoured as a life member. He was active  
in the Masons, St. Clair Lodge #135, receiving  
a 60 year, recognition pin in 2004. Gordon held  
memberships with the Milton and Esquesing  
Historical Societies as a living informational re-  
source for the communities where he grew up  
and lived his life. He felt particularly pleased to  
be consulted for Halton's Scotch Block written  
and compiled by Jim Dills and Gloria Brown  
published by the Milton Historical Society in  
2009. Gordon loved to dance! His best and  
longest dancing partner, Dee, preceded him in  
death 10 years ago leaving him immeasurably  
saddened and lonely. He is loved so dearly by  
his family and many, many friends. He will al-  
ways be remembered and his legacy to us is  
his relentlessly strong work ethic, elegant intelli-  
gence and sharp wit, his effortless humor.  
Gordon passed away on Wednesday, August  
3rd, 2011 at the Milton District Hospital in his
