GLTYC meet almost every Saturday throughout the school year. The age range is 10-18. Membership is \$20 with \$5 per any additional fall workshop, one wishes to attend. These are held from 1-3 p.m. on various Saturdays.

Throughout the fall, the workshops are aimed mostly at the actor's craft, i.e. voice, characterization, improv, along with directing, and stage management. In the spring the workshops are free and are about building the spring production, i.e. costume design and construction, set building, painting, and lighting.

The Youth Company has two performance opportunities each season. On September 17th there will be auditions for the Y1A - Youth One Acts, which will be performed November 24-26.
