

On the run

Sixty-eight runners and walkers from Georgetown and Milton got together at the Terra Cotta Conservation Area recently to determine who'll hold bragging rights for the next year between the two groups. Actually, the inaugural Georgetown Milton Memorial Run's winning trophy is named after Dave Booth and Ed Braam, longtime members of the Georgetown and Milton Runners, respectively, who passed away late last year. Using a Team Predicta Challenge format, runners and walkers estimated how long it would take to complete the 10.8-km Egg Nog Jog course at Terra Cotta and the closest 10 times from each club were counted to arrive at final total, with 68 people taking part. Although Milton's Jan Richardson was just one second off her predicted finishing time, Georgetown's competitors



prevailed with a two-minute, 54-second overall winning margin. The event will alternate between Terra Cotta and the Kelso Conservation Area each year.
