All work is completed in-house, along with repairs and relines to existing complete and partial dentures.

As a healthcare professional, Tracy is trained to recognize oral health conditions which may be indicators of changes in overall health and well-being.

"Every day I am given the opportunity to work with the challenges of individual mouths and educating patients on the importance of restoring missing teeth for overall good health," Tracy says. "It is very rewarding to make a personal connection with people and help to recreate beautiful smiles."

On Wednesday nights, all levels of dancers are invited to learn how to line dance from 6:30 p.m. onward. Thursday is Z103 night where the latest Top 40 hits are played and Saturday is the bar's legendary country night.

"It's a great atmosphere with no attitude," says Kit Andrew, CEO of 13Thirteen Entertainment. "There's electricity here. It's a unique place to come and be entertained."

Nashville North is also home to The Tennessee Chop House, a southern barbecue-style restaurant that serves southern favourites like steaks, burgers and pulled pork. Guests can sit back, relax and enjoy a tasty meal while watching the line dancers.

"The entertainment is built right in," Kit says. "It's an amazing thing to see all the people line dancing out on the dance floor."
