Carrie Burrows (Georgetown Fitness Boot Camp)

Georgetown Fitness Boot Camp owner-operator Carrie Burrows knows from personal experience that when you look better, you feel better.

"I was an overweight kid who became an obese teen," she says. "The summer before university, I was miserable and that was a turning point for me."

Carrie majored in kinesiology and lost 100 pounds. When she was pregnant, she gained the weight back and then lost it again.

"I've been through the weight loss process on my own," she says. "Now I get to help other people change their lives."

Over a four-week period, Carrie's boot campers meet for hour-long classes that combine cardio and strength training for a full body workout. She makes things challenging with different weights and equipment for each session. Classes are held outside during the spring and summer and move into school gyms during the cold seasons.

Carrie also provides one-on-one training and nutritional programs to help kids, adults and sports teams meet their fitness goals. Unlike a traditional gym, Georgetown Fitness Boot Camp provides a support system and holds its members accountable, so if you don't show up for class, you will get a call.

Susan also makes stained glass windows for fun. The Monty Python-style of stained glass teeth was another attempt to add levity to her new teeth-cleaning business.

"Whenever possible, I like to use a light, gum freezing gel to make the necessary gum measuring and scaling treatments even more comfortable," Susan says, adding that one to three millimetre pocket depths are considered healthy gum measurements and anything deeper usually indicates treatable gum disease. Frequent dental hygiene cleanings eliminate deep pockets and bleeding gums.

In a perfect world, adults would have their teeth cleaned by a registered dental hygienist every three months and would have a tooth cavity examination by a dentist once a year.

To help busy local clients, Susan will be offering extended office hours. Starting November 1, the office will be open Monday to Wednesday from 4 p.m. to 9 p.m. and Thursday to Sunday from 7 a.m. to 12 p.m. With every booked teeth-scaling visit, she offers a complimentary exam, polish, fluoride and teeth whitening.

Susan is looking forward to helping the children, teens and adults of Halton Hills attain healthy, pink gums and whiter teeth.
