



**NOTICE OF APPLICATION
FOR APPROVAL TO EXPROPRIATE LAND**

IN THE MATTER OF an application by The Regional Municipality of Halton for approval to expropriate the lands described in Schedule A set out below for the purposes of facilitating the improvement and widening of Steeles Avenue (Regional Road No. 8) from James Snow Parkway (Regional Road No. 4) to Sixth Line North and to expropriate permanent easements for the relocation, construction and maintenance of public utilities including, but not limited to, hydro poles, guy wires, anchors, drainage works, and tiebacks ancillary and necessary to the reconstruction of Steeles Avenue, and to expropriate temporary easements for municipal purposes including, but not limited to, grading and/or access for construction and maintenance of drainage works and for the reconstruction of bridges, ditches and culverts, in the Towns of Milton and Halton Hills and works ancillary thereto.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that application has been made for approval to expropriate an interest in the lands described in Schedule A set out below, in the Towns of Milton and Halton Hills.

- (a) in the case of a registered owner, served personally or by registered mail within thirty (30) days after the registered owner is served with the notice, or, when the registered owner is served by publication, within thirty (30) days after the first publication of the notice;
- (b) in the case of an owner who is not a registered owner, within thirty (30) days after the first publication of the notice.

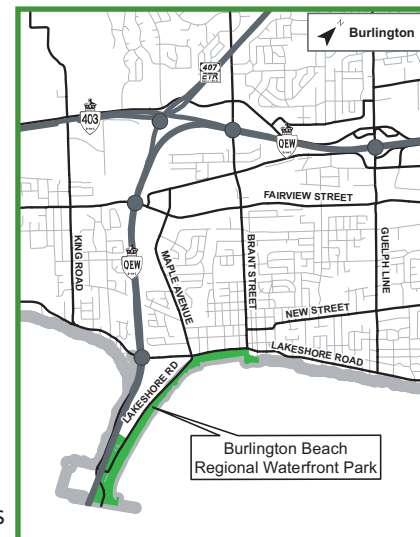


NOTICE OF STATUTORY PUBLIC MEETING
