Region approves plan to accelerate road expansion

Halton's accelerated infrastructure program will see \$615 million invested into regional roads over the next five years.

Regional council recently approved the program that aims to reduce traffic congestion by speeding up the expansion of certain roads by up to eight years.

The Region will also enhance programs already in place and ensure sufficient detour routes are in place for all projects, review and adjust traffic light timing on roads impacted by construction, and enhance the coordination of construction

activities across the Region.

Real time construction updates will be available via Twitter and updates on construction activity are available at www.halton.ca/construction.

"This year alone we've invested more than \$190 million in infrastructure," said Regional Chair Gary Carr. "We know that driving on regional roads is an important part of most people's days and I want to thank them for their patience while we work to improve not only our roads, but also the critical water and wastewater infrastructure running beneath them."

Local man hurt in crash in Erin

A 29-year-old Georgetown man suffered serious back injuries when he was thrown from his vehicle during a rollover crash on Trafalgar Rd. south of Sideroad 10 in Erin Township Friday evening.

Wellington OPP say the accident occurred about 9:10 p.m.

Police say a 2001 Dodge pickup truck was travelling north on Trafalgar Rd. and left the roadway for unknown

reasons just south of Sideroad 10. The truck rolled in the ditch throwing the driver (the lone occupant) clear of the vehicle.


