Raiders keep winning but Blades keep pace

Winning 12 of their last 13 games hasn't exactly given the Georgetown Raiders a lot of breathing room atop the Ontario Junior Hockey League's West Division standings.

Georgetown posted a pair of 7-4 victories over the Milton IceHawks this past weekend to continue their impressive late-fall run, yet they're just a point ahead of rival Oakville and the Blades hold a game in hand.

Those two clubs will collide this week for their final two regular-season meetings, with the Raiders having taken three of the first four match-ups.

The teams will meet in Georgetown Wednesday at 7:30 p.m. and hook up again Friday night in Oakville.

During the first intermission of Wednesday evening's game, the sec-

ond-annual Hospital Heroes' Hockey Challenge, pitting the Georgetown Hospital's physicians against staff members. The Raiders will donate \$1 to the Georgetown Hospital for each ticket sold.

In last Friday's win in Milton, Daniel McNamara had two goals and two assists to pace the Raider attack, which went 5 for 10 on the power play to maintain its league-best conversion rate of close to 30 per cent with the man advantage.

Tyson Fawcett (2), Stephen Genua, Patrick Megannety and Alex Lubczuk also tallied for Georgetown.

Genua notched a hat trick and added three assists in Saturday's triumph, with Ryan Lopes (2), Megannety and Manny Gialedakis rounding out the scoring.

Haas, Fender snap eight Blue Fins club records

Halton Hills Blue Fins Kyle Haas and Emma Fender combined to break eight club records during recent competitions to close out the 2011 calendar year with a bang.

At the Paul Bergen International Invitational meet near Portland, Oregon, the 16-year-old Haas bettered previous HHSF record times in the 50m backstroke (25.84 seconds) and 100m backstroke (55.43) events, placing fourth in both and missing out on a medal by just hundredths of a second.

Haas still managed to pick two bronze medals as part of Team Ontario relay finishes, which also cracked provincial records for the 4x100m freestyle and the 4x100m medley.

Those results helped him earn selection for the Swimming Canada team that will compete at events in Florida next

month.

Fender broke club records in the 11-12 age group for the 50m butterfly and 50m backstroke while competing for the Blue Fins at the Roy Jacobson Invitational meet in Vaughan earlier this month, netting seven gold medals in total for the weekend.

Blue Fins' head coach Mike Thompson has been chosen to accompany the Ontario High Performance Team to a grand prix event in Austin, Texas in January, the same competition he attended last year in Indianapolis.
