● My girlfriend won't let me see my children. •Do I still have to pay child support?

Yes, you have to pay child support even if she is not letting you see the children. It is important to find out the reasons why she is not letting you see the children so that those issues can be looked at and you can try and resolve them. Parenting counselling can often help with this issue or you could try mediation.

You have a right to see your children as well as receive information about them. You should discuss this issue with a lawyer even if you are attending parenting counselling or mediation. A lawyer can also try to help resolve the issue, but if all else fails, it may be necessary to bring the matter before the Court and have a Judge review the matter and make an Order for the terms of your access.
