

We'll 'know-it-all' Monday night Local man among final three in Discovery's challenge show

Canada's greatest know-it-all might be a Georgetown man.

Dave Spencer has made it to the final three of the Discovery Channel series *Canada's Greatest Know-It-All* and the winner will be announced in the final show of the season set to air Monday (Mar. 19) 10 p.m. on Discovery Channel.

The 39-year-old Georgetown resident, a millwright by trade, has been up against nine other competitors from across the country vying for the title.

The show's billed as "the ultimate brain-busting competition, featuring 10 of Canada's biggest self-proclaimed smarties competing head to head in a super sized arena of grit and wit."

Every episode has contained several complex group and individual tasks- each challenge having a built-in secret twist. The competitor with the fewest points after each episode's final challenge has been eliminated.

Some of the challenges Spencer and the other competitors faced included determining based on airspeed, height, weight, wind direction and gravity the correct release point of a 'bomb' (flour sack) dropped from a Lancaster bomber to hit a target on

the ground, a race against the clock to extract synthetic human bones out of blocks of ice and reassemble them into an anatomically correct skeleton, designing and building unpowered aircraft, and constructing a massive trebuchet to play the ultimate game of Trojan basketball.

The show was filmed last June.

Spencer, who won't even hint at the show's outcome, said he enjoyed the experience immensely.

"It was life-changing," said Spencer, a married father of two. "It was so much fun experiencing these amazing challenges with these incredible people."

Spencer and his family and friends will gather with some cast and crew of the show to watch the final episode Monday night.

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
