

Hold removed on Eden Oak

Town council approved the removal of the H—holding provision—for Eden Oak 142 townhome subdivision at 60 Main St. N. in Georgetown. The removal will allow the developer to apply for building permits.

For removal of the H, the developer had to fulfill five conditions: a site plan agreement, allocation of water and wastewater servicing, approval of urban and architectural design guidelines, provision of two vehicle activated traffic calming signs and dollars for a possible future traffic signals on Main St. N. at Carruthers Rd./Ewing St.

Eden Oak has also paid the Town-required \$1,000 per unit— \$142,000 to go to the arena fund.

Consultant hired

Town council approved the hiring of consultant, Macaulay Shiomi Howson Ltd. for the Norval Secondary Plan review. The cost amounts to \$74,283. The

intent of the review is to update the Plan with regard to the new planning and zoning policies, the new Credit Valley Conservation floodplain mapping, and options recommended by the Halton Peel Boundary Area Transportation Study for a Norval bypass.

Contract awarded

Town council has awarded a tender for safety supplies to Levitt Safety of Oakville. The three-year contract, with options to renew, amounts to \$113,000. It's based on a purchase history of about \$20,000 a year.

Trucks purchased

Town council has awarded a tender for two tandem trucks with snow equipment to Highway Sterling Western Star of Ayr. The purchase amounts to \$475,359.36. One truck is a new purchase while the other is a replacement buy.
