Feuding mall builders end legal action

The mall war in Halton Hills appears to be over.

Halton Hills Mayor Rick Bonnette announced Tuesday that the outstanding litigation and Ontario Municipal Board proceeding involving RioCan Real Estate Investment Trust and Calloway Real Estate Investment Trust, both planning to build outlet malls in the 401 Corridor, have been resolved.

RioCan has withdrawn its court application, filed last month, against the Town of Halton Hills concerning the Calloway development proposal. RioCan was asking the court to quash the bylaws passed by the Town to enable the construction of the 450,000 sq. ft. \$170 million outlet mall in Hornby.

At the same time, Calloway has withdrawn its outstanding appeals before the Ontario Municipal Board related to RioCan's development proposal for a similar outlet mall at James Snow Parkway and Steeles

Mayor Rick Bonnette said the settlement was good news.
