

Mall builders end legal feud

"It's good to see they've come to a resolution," said Bonnette. "They're all going to play nicely in the sandbox and they're not going to oppose each other's development."

He said he's looking "forward to working with both corporations on these important economic development initiatives."

"We are pleased with the outcome of the settlement and look forward to a very successful project," said Al Mawani, CEO, Callo-way REIT.

Calloway has received both the foun-

dation permit and super structure permit for the mall.

"They are making plans for a ground-breaking," said Bonnette, adding it will be the first Premium Outlet Mall in Canada.

He stressed it won't be a big-box style mall instead featuring stores in the range of 10,000 to 15,000 sq. ft.

"RioCan is still going ahead with some sort of commercial develop-

ment. We look forward to working with them," he said.

At press time no one from RioCan was available for comment.

Energy use falls 3.9% during Earth Hour

The Town of Halton Hills is declaring last Saturday's Earth Hour event in the community a success.

In 2012, with the growing support of numerous local businesses, schools, residents, and Town and Halton Hills Hydro staff, during Earth Hour, energy consumption dropped by nearly 4% (3.9%) or 2.07MW. This is enough electricity to power approximately 1,700 homes for an hour. The 3.9% savings for Earth Hour 2012 is a significant increase over the 2011 reduction of approximately 0.9%.

Overall, since first participating in Earth Hour in 2008, the community has saved enough electricity to power a total of about 17,200 average homes for one hour.

Throughout Halton Hills, participants included businesses within the Acton and Georgetown BIAs and those located

throughout the Town, TransCanada Energy, schools of the Halton District School Board and the Halton Catholic District School Board (including Robert Little Public School, Park Public School, and Christ the King Secondary School which held special activities to celebrate Earth Hour), and the hundreds of residents, businesses, students and Town staff who signed an Earth Hour 'Pledge' which travelled

throughout the Town prior to Earth Hour. "Together, our community has made Earth Hour a success and demonstrated its commitment to reducing energy use, reducing utility costs and bringing awareness to global warming. Earth Hour is one practical action that we can all take every year to show our commitment to a more sustainable future. I am proud of our community's achievements," said Mayor Rick Bonnette.
