top shape, it should be maintained on a yearly basis. Out with the Old

An older deck, especially one included in a home purchase, may have more deep rooted problems that need to be tackled. If the deck has moisture damage or rot in deck framing it is most likely time to look into a new deck. One deteriorating joist or post usually indicates that more will soon follow.
