Thomson earns spot in tourney

Overcoming a shaky start to his final round, Georgetown's Ryan Thomson earned a berth in this week's NCAA Division II national golf championships in Kentucky thanks to a clutch performance at a regional qualifying event last week in Pennsylvania.

Thomson, 21, in his junior year of the golf management program at West Liberty University in West Virginia, bogeyed four of the first six holes in the third and final round of the NCAA Division II East/Atlantic Super Regional tournament at the Hershey Country Club, then was one over par through the final 12 holes in soggy conditions to finish with a fourover 75, earning one of two spots in the national championship, which begins today (Tuesday).

A Christ the King graduate and Club at North Halton member, Thomson recorded rounds of 77-75-75 at the qualifier for the Hilltoppers.

The Georgetown Bowl junior boys' team consisting of Nick Hancock, Robert Mc-Dougall, Jason Reid and Nicholas Ridley captured the first Youth Bowling Canada National Championship title banner for the local lanes since a bantam girls' squad captured gold medals at the 2003 tourney in Regina, defeating a team from Edmonton in a tiebreaking championship final.


