Whether your home is on a small lot or a spacious property, Credit Valley Conservation (CVC) is helping residents create beautiful backvard habitats

"Going natural can save you time and money in the long run," said Alison Qua-Enoo, Program Coordinator for Escarpment Outreach. "Why strive for a manicured and high maintenance lawn and garden when you can have an attractive, all-season yard with native shrubs and flowers, that will benefit local wildlife and help the environment?'

Native plants have an advantage because they can withstand lower rainfall in the summer without watering. CVC staff can identify native plants that are resistant to a wider range of local pests, making chemical treatment unnecessary. Native plants can withstand competition from other plants, which means less weeding.

Information in this workshop is meant for neighbourhoods in Halton Hills, but everyone is welcome to attend. Local residents can sign up to receive a free native tree or shrub at the event when registering. Register by calling 905-670-1615, ext. 436.
