Contractors will start with alterations to the hospital's internal roadways and parking lots required to redirect traffic during

construction and regain parking spaces that will be lost due to the expansion. Once the site preparation is complete, work on the new ER will begin.

Wellington-Halton MPP Ted Arnott thanked the Government of Ontario for coming through with funding for the project and congratulated the community for its efforts in making the project a reality.

"As I've often said, the most eloquent speech in the Legislature touting a community project never amounts to a hill of beans unless the

project is a good one, which has a lot of strong community support. The Georgetown Hospital project is a very good one with a lot of strong community support," said Arnott.

The groundbreaking also marked the launch of the Georgetown Hospital Foundation's capital campaign 'Investing in Care-Close to Home.'
