For the second straight year, a Christ the King student has come away from the provincial high school track & field championships with a silver medal in one of the field events.

Grade 9 student Aleks Rapp hadn't competed in shot put or discus prior to arriving in high school and doesn't belong to a club, yet the 15-year-old Georgetown resident earned two top-10 results at last week's Ontario Federation of School Athletic Associations meet in Brockville.

Rapp's second of six throws in the midget boys' shot put measured 14.87m, which was 22cm farther than the bronze medalist and 68cm behind the winner, Matthew Rosati of Toronto's Chaminade College.

Rapp also finished ninth in the midget boys' discus with a toss of 39.64m

Jaguar Tyler Renton earned a silver medal in the senior boys' javelin at last year's OFSAA championships.

CtK's Haleigh Baines placed 20th last week in the OFSAA midget girls' 3,000m.
