## School Year 2012-2013 Junior/Senior Kindergarten

### REGISTER NOW

**Note:** If your child is currently attending one of our schools for Junior Kindergarten, do not register for Senior Kindergarten.

Junior Kindergarten	Senior Kindergarten
must be 4 years old by December 31, 2012	must be 5 years old by December 31, 2012

To determine your designated home school, access our website [www.hdsb.ca](http://www.hdsb.ca) and click on the "Schools" tab, then "School Locator". Call your designated school to find out which dates have been established for Kindergarten registration.

#### Please bring the following original documents with you to register:

- Proof of address: lease or purchase agreement or current property tax bill.
- Proof of age: birth certificate or passport or baptismal/faith document for your child.
- Proof of citizenship: birth certificate or passport or Record of Landing (IMM 1000) or Permanent Resident card.
- Proof of immunization or philosophical or religious exemption forms (completed medical authorization where necessary).

If you are not the child's parent, or if you have sole custody, please bring proof of custody (court order).

**Please register your child by February 17, 2012.**

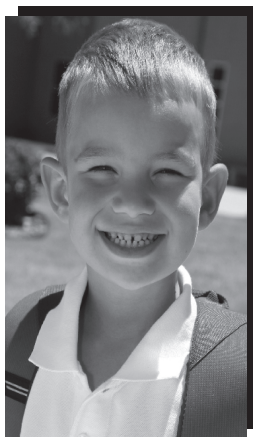

## Ready for winter

When it snows, Mayor Rick Bonnette reminds residents that staff will do their very best to ensure that the roads are maintained for safety. Everyone is asked to be patient, as it may take some time for the ploughs to get to all the local streets.

The Town clears over 900-km of roads, 125-km sidewalks, and 25 municipal parking lots. Winter control is performed in priority

sequence with Regional roads first, followed by arterial roads, collector roads and then local roads. Heavy snowfall or successive storms extend winter control activities resulting in delays getting to the local roads.

Halton Hills has a Town-wide parking prohibition on streets between 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. from November 15 to April 15 for night-time snow clearing operations. Sidewalk snow clearing

starts within 12 hours of the snow event and is completed within 48 hours.

Residents are asked to clear snow away from fire hydrants, and not to shovel snow back onto the roadways, as per By-Law #90-68. Also, ensure that garbage and blue boxes are kept off the roadways.
