Halton Hills Mayor Rick Bonnette is an ex-officio member of the team.

Hooper and Poulstrup are confident that the campaign will reach its \$2 million objective.

"As we approach businesses, corporations, individuals and many others to explain this pressing need in Halton Hills, we are confident that financial support will follow in a significant manner," the group stated in a press release

The overall cost of the expansions is \$29.2 million. The majority of funding is coming from the Town of Halton Hills and through increased user fees from the HHAUG. However, an additional \$2 million is required from the community at large to meet the full cost.

"This is not just about ice; it is about providing Halton Hills residents of all ages with increased recreational and community space to meet the growing demand," said Lewis.

Both facilities are operating beyond full capacity requiring many residents, teams and programs to go "out of town" for the space they need.

Construction on two new additional ice surfaces has begun at Mold-Masters SportsPlex and this project will be com-

pleted in the fall 2013.

The Acton Arena and Community Centre expansion, which will see an additional ice pad added, will begin in mid-spring 2013 with completion scheduled for the fall of 2014.

The campaign will be approaching corporations, small businesses, individuals, charitable foundations, service clubs and associations and the community at large. The active phase of the campaign has just begun and will continue through September 2013.
