It was an exciting weekend for the Chudleigh's Acton Tanners Novice BB team that continued their tear on an eleven game OMHA playoff win streak with two victories to open the best of seven OMHA Championship Final series with Erin-Hillsburgh.

In the opening game with pressure on in enemy territory, the Tanners jumped out quick and struck early when Jackson Phillips fired one in from Owen Kennedy and Riley Drexler. For the rest of the first, the Devils maintained pressure, but Matthew Lantz held the fort and kept Acton alive turning away 14 Devils' shots. The Tanners offence took over from there, potting three goals in each of the final two frames for the 7-2 win. Scoring for Acton were Phillips (4G, A), Evan

Ashe (G, 2A), Drexler (G, 2A), Matthew Geim (G), Thomas Holmes (2A), and Kennedy, Jaret Rosenberg and Jordan Caruso with an assist each.
