The second was in the Acton Community Hall on Fire Safety. Halton Hills Captain Doug Andrews made a thought provoking presentation. I now have to go shopping for new smoke detectors and a new CO detector. Did you know that after seven to ten years you should replace your smoke detector? A CO detector's life is even less, five to seven years. It is also a good practice to gently vacuum the outsides of all detectors on a regular basis.
