# Hill looking sharp on the farm

Georgetown's Shawn Hill has taken a few more positive steps to returning to the Major Leagues with the Toronto Blue Jays' triple-A farm team in Las Vegas as he's undefeated in six starts with the 51s.

The 31-year-old righthanded pitcher wasn't his sharpest last week, giving up nine hits and five earned runs over five innings, but still got the 11-5 win over Fresno to improve to 4-0 with Las Vegas

since he signed with Toronto last month.

In his previous two starts, Hill gave up just one run through a combined 15 innings, striking out 14 batters while allowing just two walks.

The Bishop Reding High School grad has struggled through a number of surgeries to his throwing arm and is hopeful of getting called up by the Blue Jays, for whom he last pitched in 2010.
