

Highway 401 Improvements from East of the Credit River to Trafalgar Road W.O. 07-20021

THE PROJECT

URS Canada Inc. has been retained by the Ontario Ministry of Transportation (MTO) to undertake a Preliminary Design and Class Environmental Assessment Study for improvements to Highway 401 from east of the Credit River to Trafalgar Road (9.7 km) in the Town of Milton and the Town of Halton Hills, in Halton Region, and the City of Mississauga, in the Region of Peel.

The study has identified the capacity and operational needs for this section of the Highway 401 corridor. The recommended improvements include widening this section of the Highway 401 corridor, incorporation of high occupancy vehicle (HOV) lanes and improvements to an existing as well as a new commuter parking lot. Structural, illumination, drainage and interchange modifications are also proposed as part of the recommended highway improvements.



THE PROCESS

This study has followed the approved planning process for Group 'B' projects under the *Class Environmental Assessment for Provincial Transportation Facilities* (2000). A Transportation Environmental Study Report (TESR) will be prepared and made available for a 30-day public review period at the completion of the study, which will document the transportation opportunities, the generation, assessment and evaluation of alternatives, the recommended plan, a summary of environmental issues and potential mitigation measures and a summary of consultation undertaken throughout the study. Notice of TESR submission and public review period will be advertised in this newspaper and mailed to those on the project mailing list.

PUBLIC INFORMATION CENTRE

The public is invited to attend the second and the final Public Information Centre (PIC) for this study. The purpose of PIC #2 is to present and receive input on the evaluation of alternatives, the preliminary details of the recommended plan and the proposed mitigation strategies to minimize potential environmental and community impacts. **PIC #2 will be held on:**
