## Jr. A Raiders extend win streak to three with win over Toronto

The Georgetown Raiders collected their third consecutive Ontario Junior Hockey League win on Sunday evening, defeating the host Toronto Jr. Canadiens 3-1 at Etobicoke's Chesswood Arenas.

Veteran centre Brendan Woods of London kept up his strong run of play recently scoring once and adding two assists to grab the lead in team scoring. Linemate Nick Perruccio added a goal and a helper, with Robbie Murden providing an insurance marker with four minutes remaining in regulation.

Rookie goalkeeper Daniel Mannella made 27 saves for the win.

Suspensions continue to pose a problem for the Raiders, who lost two more top players with multiple-gamers on Sunday. Forward Drake Hart will miss

the next four starts after being assessed with a checking-from-behind match penalty in Sunday's contest, while defender Jake Emilio was handed a two-game ban following a head-checking major against the Jr. Canadiens.

Blueliner Thomas Welsh has three more games to serve stemming from a fight in last Wednesday's 3-1 victory over the guest Hamilton Red Wings.

Forward Tyson Fawcett, who was the Raiders' regular season and playoff MVP last season, has signed with the Ontario Hockey League's Barrie Colts.

This Saturday, the Raiders host the 5-1-0 Oakville Blades, who haven't lost since the opening night of the season to Georgetown. Game time at the Alcott Arena is 7:30 p.m.

Georgetown District High School's junior Rebels chalked up an impressive 32-14 over the Iroquois Ridge Trailblazers at Kiwanis Field, with running back Aaron Steffens scoring four touchdowns on the afternoon.

## Hill up with Jays

Georgetown's Shawn Hill has been rewarded for a strong showing in the minors this summer with a call-up to the Toronto Blue Jays for the final week of the Major Baseball League regular season.

The 31-year-old righthanded pitcher flew over from Germany, where he'd helped Canada win its opener of the World Baseball Classic qualifier last Thursday, to join the Jays for their doubleheader in Baltimore Monday.

Hill started 15 games for Toronto's AAA affiliate in Las Vegas this year, posting a 9-2 record with a 4.52 ERA. It's his second stint with the Jays after compiling a 1-2 record with a 2.61 ERA in four starts in 2010.

He threw six solid innings against Great Britain Thursday, striking out seven batters and allowing just three hits in an 11-1 Canadian victory.
