NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING Regarding Development Charges

Take notice that on Monday June 25, 2012, the Council of the Town of Halton Hills will hold a public meeting pursuant to The Development Charges Act, 1997, regarding proposed development charge rates and policies that will be applied throughout the Town. It is proposed that enactment of a development charges by-law by Council would occur on Monday, July 9, 2012.

Development charges are levied against new development, and are a primary source of funding for growth-related capital expenditures. Townwide capital services include library, fire protection, recreation and parks, public works, parking, general government, roads and related, and storm water management services.

Council is required under The Development Charges Act, 1997, to hold at least one public meeting to allow the public the opportunity to review and provide comments on the 2012 Development Charges Study, related staff reports and the proposed development charges by-law.


The above events all took place within weeks, if not days of each other. They will have positive effects on our community for decades. What a ride this has been.
