I was too young to watch it during its today if it is on during its decades of rebroadcast.

If you haven't seen that show, I can guarantee you have at some point in your life watched Family Feud. I've watched the new version. I don't like it. I can hardly believe I've watched it on television since 1976. There have been different Thanks Newkirk." RIP.

After he retired the first time, they brought him back again but it was too late. They had already changed things and the show's time and place were gone.
