Smoke complaint
Smoke from two outdoor fires burning at adjacent Wallace Street residences sparked a burn complaint at 12:42 p.m. on Friday. Acton firefighters allowed the fire to burn out.

Lightening strike
Acton firefighters responded to two calls about burning trees and downed hydro lines within five minutes of each

other, just after 5:51 last Thursday in the area of Highway 7 and the Fifth Line.

The first tree was hit by a lightening strike and firefighters extinguished the blaze. In the second instance, crews determined that the tree hit by lightening was not on fire, and firefighters stayed on scene until Halton Hills Hydro arrived to deal with the downed lines.
