
CONGRATULATIONS TO THE CLASS OF

I want to first express my excitement at being appointed the Halton District school Board Trustee for Halton Hills Wards 1, 2, 3 and 4. As a lifelong resident of Halton Hills (I was born in Esquesing Township, attended Speyside, Stewarttown and Georgetown District High School) it is a great honour to have been chosen. As you know the questions that were asked in the Trustee candidate interviews were a matter of public record. I thought it might be helpful

for me to provide a summary of my answers as a way of introducing myself.

"What is the most significant challenge or opportunity facing public education and how should the Halton District School Board prepare for it?"

The challenge, as I see it, is to prepare all children and youth to become vibrant engaged members of the community. I have heard it said that we are now preparing and educating children and youth to be able to successful undertake jobs that have not even been created yet. I believe the challenge is to educate and support children to become confident in both what they know and in their ability to learn and grow. Preparing for this will require open minds and the desire to be flexible while at the same time consistent and equitable to meet the needs of all.
