

# Acton beach water safe

The Halton Health Department monitors the water quality at public beaches throughout Halton and results released August 2 showed the Old

Beach on Prospect Park is safe for swimming.

The following beaches are also safe for swimming:

- Burlington - Beach-

way Park

- Milton - Kelso Conservation Area
- Oakville - Coronation Park East, Bronte Park Beach

The following beaches are unsafe for swimming:

- Oakville - Coronation Park West

For the most recent information, the Health

Department recommends that residents visit Halton Region's website halton.ca/beaches before visiting Halton beaches.

Residents can call Halton Region to find out which beaches have been posted as safe or unsafe for swimming due to

poor water quality. Beach water quality information is available 24 hours a day by dialling 311 or toll free 1-866-442-5866.

During regular business hours ask for beach information, and after regular business hours press 2 for health information.

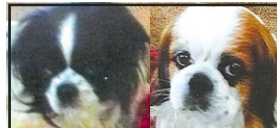
