## Heritage Acton fundraiser

The Absolutely Acton Speakers' Series, initiated, by the late Tracey Tyler – a proud Acton resident and member of Heritage Acton – will continue in her honour. The second season features guests lined up by Tyler before her recent death.

Tyler was the Legal Affairs reporter for the Toronto Star, and like most of last season's guest speakers, there is a "justice" theme to the new line-up which begins Sunday, September 16, with a catered dinner and musical performance by Baldori and Migliazza, who have played piano and harmonica with performers, including Chuck Berry, since 1967.

Tyler met "Boogie Bob" Baldoria, a New York entertainment lawyer, during a case, and she booked him when she learned of his musical talents and his show, Four Hands, Twenty Fingers and 100 Years of Boogie, which promises to rock the Town Hall Centre.

Heritage Acton member Lloyd McIntyre said on Sunday that they wanted to honour Tyler who invented the Speakers' Series to help raise money for renovations at the Town Hall Centre, including an elevator. "We are going to try and make it (the Series) an annual event," he said, adding the other speakers include:

- Canada's Dominatrix Terri-Jean Bedford and Osgoode Law Professor Alan Young will talk about their on-going Supreme Court of Canada fight against prostitution on Sunday, November 25. Recently they succeeded at the Ontario Court of Appeal when several Criminal Code provisions dealing with prostitution were struck down.
- On Sunday, January 20, Michelle Shephard, the Star's National Security writer will talk about global terrorism and her career as a foreign correspondent in very dangerous places, includ-


