

Dozers win three-pitch crown in Rockwood

Another successful season for the Rockwood Men's Three Pitch League came to a close this past weekend with the crowning of a new league champ, the Dozers. They added this honour to their first place finish during the regular season. In the final, the Dozers gave the always tough Grey Sox a very uncharacteristic shellacking, beating them 34 to 17.
