Rural safety results

Speeding was the big issue during the recent Halton police Operation Impact pubic safety campaign on rural roads. Between September 24 and Thanksgiving weekend police clocked 265 hours on traffic enforcement and 28 hours of RIDE (Reduce Impaired

Driving Everywhere) spot checks and issued 604 provincial offence notices – the majority for speeding.

Over the Thanksgiving weekend, Operation Impact stops regionwide resulted in four impaired driving charges, 29 charges of distracted driving, 415 for aggressive driving/ speeding, five seatbelt offences, and three charges of prohibited driving.

Six short-term licence suspensions were issued to drivers who received a warning from a road side breath test.
