After six red and green trees flanking the big tree in front of the Acton arena also went dark, Acton BIA manager Josey Bonnette found 10 extension cords bringing power to the trees had been stolen, one wrenched

violently, breaking the plug.

"It's disheartening – it's a shame," Bonnette said on Tuesday, hoping that the lights will stay on until the New Year. The Acton Tree of Hope has been decorated for the past two years as part of the Light Up The Hills community holiday celebration.

On a bright note, after learning of the theft, BIA Board Chair Nancy Wilkes offered to pay to replace the stolen extension cords.

values. It said the Credit River is one of the most ecologically diverse ecosystems in all of Canada and had the most diverse coldwater fishery in Ontario.
