One sad story

On March 26, 2010, 17 yearold Matthew McGregor attended a party with friends. That night, Matthew made many good decisions. He had been drinking and made the right choice by deciding to stay the night.

When he woke up a few hours later, he walked home. Upon arrival, he realized that he needed something at the store. Because it was just around the corner, he decided to drive.

Matthew was dead by 5:30 a.m. on March 27th. He was killed in the single-vehicle collision, less than three minutes from

Please consider Matthew's story before you get into a car either as a passenger or a driver. You have a responsibility to yourself, your friends and your family to be safe.

- In 2011, Halton Regional Police issued 447 temporary license suspensions and laid 383 impaired driving charges
- Statistics Canada reports that impaired driving have increased for the fourth time in the past five
- -2011 90,300 incidents impaired driving across Canada


