

News digest

Impaired drivers

A Georgetown man and a Gravenhurst man were both charged with impaired driving last week. The 45-year-old Georgetown man was stopped on the Ninth Line near Five Sideroad when police spotted a car travelling north in the south-bound lane Wednesday.
