

# Acton darts player tourney finalist

There is a blind draw doubles tournament at the skyline with a prize of \$2000. This past weekend saw the beginning of the Legions' tourneys leading towards provincial and national titles.

The Georgetown contingent did not fare too well, none of us qualifying for the quarter final rounds of singles or doubles.

Monday evening's Halton division grinds onwards. Top team Time Out No. 1 were short by one player and still

came through by a large margin over second place, before the match, McGibbon No. 1. Brad Teomans, Randy Hunt and Paul Kirby recorded singles wins for McGibbon, Kirby a winner without throwing a dart. Ian McDonald and Marty Wheeler took a doubles win for the only other points for the visitors. A strong performance by the leaders to strengthen their position into a 43 point lead. O'Tooles took fair advantage to move into second place following their convincing win over McGibbon No. 2. Linda Nicholson recorded the only point for the gals in beating Jim Carrick in singles. The lads are ahead of McGibbon No. 1 by two points at this stage. Third place Hollywood are level with McGibbon and are poised to move up following their also convincing win over Brackens. Wednesday's Industrial League continues with Snowjacks, Hustlers and Steep Rock leading their respective divisions. Whereas the first division has a 30 point spread between No. 1 and No. 2 places; the second division is much closer with a five point difference. The real battle in the first is the next three spots in the standings. Exports are current second place with Westenders and Ensigns close behind.
