From preregistered programs to spur of the moment drop-in activities, there's plenty to do in and around Halton Hills during March Break next week.

At the libraries

The theme of the week at both Acton and Georgetown libraries is 'The Tropics.'

Tomorrow (Sunday) musician Jack Grunsky will entertain children of all ages at the John Elliott Theatre, Georgetown at 2 p.m. Tickets cost \$1. Call 873-2681 for information.

Tuesday at the Acton and Georgetown libraries children five years old and up are invited to dress up in tropical clothes and create a tropical seascape to hang in a window or on a wall. That runs from 2 p.m. to 3 p.m.

Wednesday your kids can drop in at either library and make a pet that they can take home. The theme is the south seas, so the pets will be tropical fish and crabs.

On Thursday at the Georgetown Library children aged five years and older should drop in between 10 a.m. and noon to make a collage around a folder to keep secret things in.

Tomorrow (Sunday) skating at the Acton Arena and Memorial Arena in Acton will be open from 2.30 p.m. to 3.50 p.m. On March 13 to 17 (Monday to Friday) Acton Arena will be open between 2.30 p.m.

On March 19 free skating will be available between 2.30 p.m. and 3.50 p.m. at Memorial. And in Acton the arena will be open to the public between 3 p.m. and 4.20 p.m. on March 25 and between 2.30 p.m. and 3.50 p.m. on March 26.

There will be public swimming at both the Acton and Georgetown pools March 13 to 19 (Monday to Sunday) from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m.

On March 13 to 16 (Monday to Thursday) there will be a special ski program at Glen Eden with bus transportation at Gordon Alcott Arena in Acton and McKenzie Smith Middle School in Acton, and other locations in Halton Hills.

It's a four-day downhill ski program which will follow Glen Eden's Junior Ski Star Program. One, two-hour lesson will be provided each day with the remainder of the time spent in free skiing. For more information call 877-5185, ext. 260.

Mountsberg is located on Milborough Line just west of Campbellville. For more information call 336-1158 (weekdays) or 854-2276 (weekends).

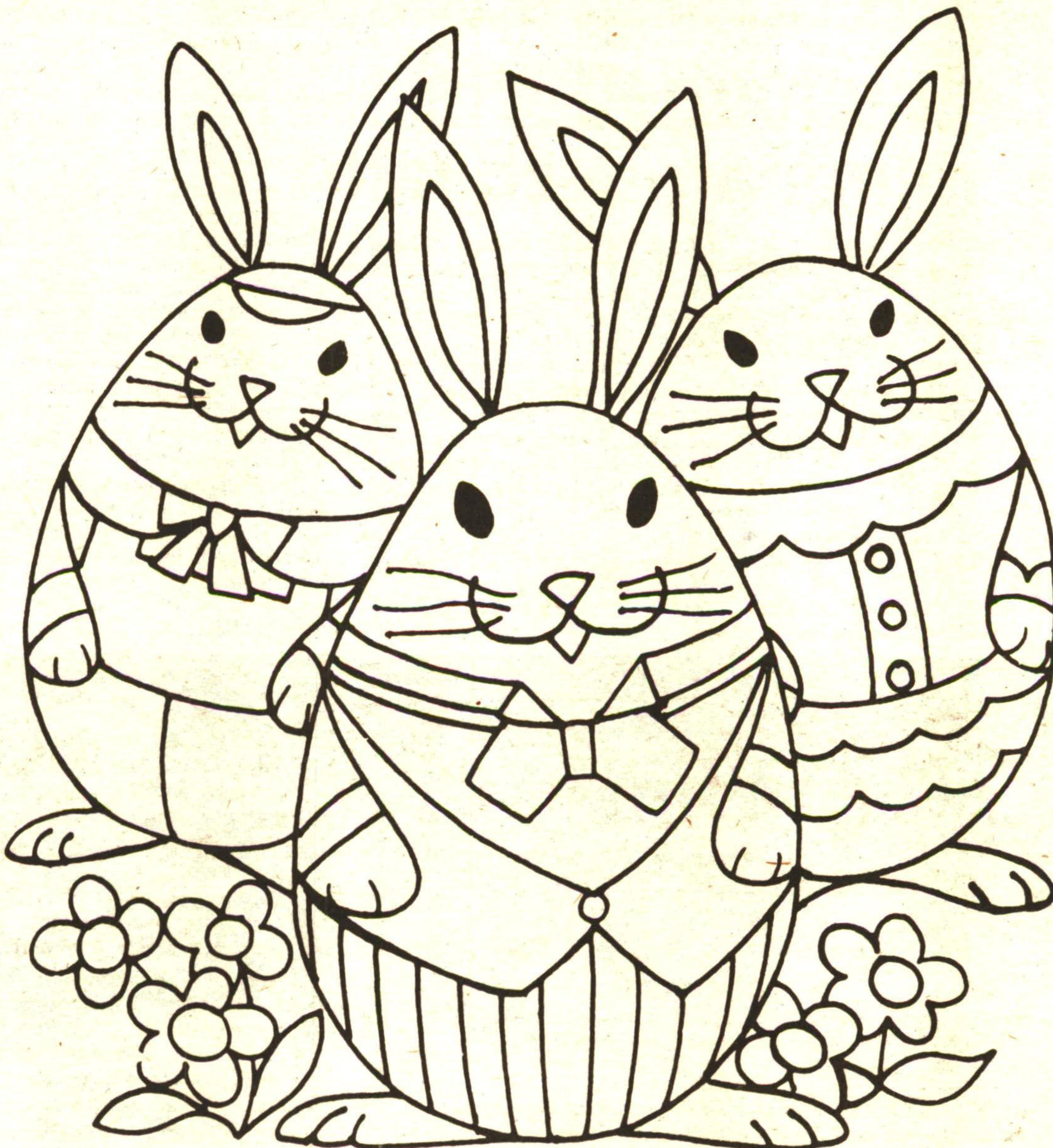
Used book search
