

The next meeting will be held at Lois Fraser's home, January 9, 1990.


## Prepare the nation's budget Turner asks constituents

How many times have you complained that you could do a better job at managing the country's finances than Michael Wilson?

Now's your chance ... sort of. Halton-Peel MP Garth Turner is going to let you prepare the nation's budget, slashing where you want to cut spending. It's all contained in a new booklet he has prepared and sent to all households in the riding.

The purpose of the booklet is threefold: to inform the constituent how Ottawa is spending taxpayers' dollars, to show what a difficult decision- making process it is, and to find out where the constituent wants to cut spending.

It's a three step process, and all you need is a calculator and your opinions. First on a worksheet listing 182 categories of actual federal expenditures, you write in how much you think should be spent. This can be an eye-opener.




Halton-Peel MP Garth Turner takes his turn at preparing the nation's budget.
